Introduction:

The students were supplied 12 questions through the online platform of the College website in which they were instructed to respond to all the questions given. This report summarizes the feedback provided by students regarding their courses and teaching experiences. A total of 54 students participated in the survey, offering valuable insights into their perceptions of course content, teaching methods, and overall learning experiences.


Modalities to fill out the questionnaire: -

2. List of questions with major findings

- 1. The courses studied by me are relevant and the contents are revised at reasonable intervals.(11 students strongly agreed while 43 students agreed)
- 2. The courses studied by me have enhanced my knowledge as well as my skills and my capabilities.(23 students strongly agreed while 36 students agreed)
- 3. The entire syllabus is/will be completed in time.(21 students strongly agreed while 34 students agreed)
- 4. Modern teaching aids, powerpoint presentations, web resources, e-content etc. are used by most of the teachers while teaching.(21 students strongly agreed while 29 students agreed)
- 5. The teachers guide the students for overall personality development of the students.(13 students strongly agreed while 35 students agreed)
- 6. The teachers provide the students with opportunities to learn and grow.(21 students strongly agreed while 32 students agreed)
- 7. The teachers give regular and timely feedback on the performance of the students.(18 students strongly agreed while 32 students agreed)
- 8. The assessment and evaluation process are fair and unbiased.(19 students strongly agreed while 38 students agreed)
- 9. The teachers encourage the students to participate in extra-curricular, and cocurricular activities and research projects.(22 students strongly agreed while 38 students agreed)
- 10. The teachers encourage the students to use reference books, e-resources, e-journals, etc.(16 students strongly agreed while 42 students agreed)
- 11. The teachers keep the students updated about the latest developments in the subject/area of knowledge.(18 students strongly agreed while 40 students agreed)
- 12. The teachers take an active interest in arranging field visits, study tours etc. to enhance learning.(11 students strongly disagreed while 23 students disagreed)

3. Result Summary

Course Relevance and Content Revision:

The majority of students expressed satisfaction with the relevance and timely revision of course contents. Specifically, 11 students strongly agreed, while 43 students agreed that the courses studied are relevant and content is revised at reasonable intervals.

Knowledge and Skill Enhancement:

In terms of knowledge and skill enhancement, 23 students strongly agreed, and 36 students agreed that the courses have effectively enhanced their knowledge, skills, and capabilities.

Timely Syllabus Completion:

A significant number of students, with 21 strongly agreeing and 34 agreeing, reported that the entire syllabus is or will be completed in a timely manner.

Use of Modern Teaching Aids:

Regarding teaching methods, 21 students strongly agreed and 29 agreed that most teachers use modern teaching aids, such as PowerPoint presentations, web resources, and e-content, in their teaching.

Personality Development and Learning Opportunities:

The students reported positively on the role of teachers in their overall development. Thirteen students strongly agreed, while 35 students agreed that teachers guide them for overall personality development. Additionally, 21 students strongly agreed, and 32 students agreed that teachers provide opportunities for learning and growth.

Timely Feedback and Fair Assessment:

Student feedback also indicated that teachers provide regular and timely feedback on their performance, with 18 students strongly agreeing and 32 agreeing. Moreover, 19 students strongly agreed, and 38 students agreed that the assessment and evaluation process is fair and unbiased.

Encouragement for Extracurricular Activities:

The majority of students felt encouraged to participate in extracurricular and co-curricular activities, as well as research projects. Specifically, 22 students strongly agreed, and 38 students agreed that teachers actively encouraged these activities.

Promotion of Additional Learning Resources:

Regarding the utilization of additional learning resources, 16 students strongly agreed, and 42 students agreed that teachers encourage them to use reference books, e-resources, e-journals, and other supplementary materials.

Keeping Students Updated:

A considerable number of students felt well-informed about the latest developments in their subject or area of knowledge. Eighteen students strongly agreed, while 40 students agreed that teachers keep them updated about such developments.


Field Visits and Study Tours:


Modalities to fill out the questionnaire: -

Feedback Analysis:


1. Syllabus is suitable to the course and need based.

22 responses





2. The course/syllabus has good balance between theory and application or practical. 22 responses





3. The learning objectives are clear and appropriate to the program.




Generally positive feedback (Agree: 9, Strongly Agree: 4) suggests that the learning objectives are considered clear and appropriate for the program.

4. The curriculum has the potential in developing the habit of self-learning among the students. 22 responses




Most respondents either agree or strongly agree (Agree: 11, Strongly Agree: 4) that the curriculum has the potential to foster self-learning among students.

5. The syllabus designed in a way to improve Employment. 22 responses




A majority tend to agree (Agree: 9) that the syllabus was designed to improve employment prospects.

6. The syllabus is helpful for competitive examination. 22 responses




The responses vary but lean towards neutrality (Neutral: 8), suggesting a balanced view on whether the syllabus caters specifically to competitive exams.


8. Teaching - learning process enables clear understanding of the course content. ^{22 responses}

9. The curriculum has focus on skill development.



The feedback generally leans towards agreement (Agree: 9) that the curriculum has a focus on skill development.


10. The syllabus cover modern & advanced topics.

22 responses




There's a tendency towards agreement (Agree: 10) that the syllabus covers modern and advanced topics.

They emphasize the necessity for a curriculum that strikes a balance between theoretical knowledge and practical application, encouraging students to apply their acquired knowledge in their chosen fields. Moreover, the teachers stress the importance of integrating recent developments, providing hands-on training, and fostering skill development within the

curriculum. Despite the adherence to the curriculum outlined by Dibrugarh University as an affiliated college, there is a call for a comprehensive review and upgrade of the syllabus to ensure it meets contemporary needs and allows for greater adaptability and application of knowledge in real-world scenarios. The teachers advocate for a platform facilitating discussions and collaboration between the university and subject teachers to effect necessary improvements.

4. Conclusion

The faculty feedback generally portrays positive perceptions regarding the suitability of the syllabus, its focus on skill development, clarity in learning objectives, and the coverage of contemporary topics. However, there are varying opinions on elements like the balance between theory and application, relevance to competitive exams, and the interest level of students. Overall, the majority of responses suggest a well-designed curriculum, but with some room for improvement in certain areas.

- ✓ Suggestions were requested from the alumni in the last question.



This suggests a shared concern among a few alumni regarding the practical and hands-on experience provided by the program. Addressing these specific areas may further enhance the program's effectiveness.

C. Suggestion by alumni

The suggestions propose enhancements to the current educational approach. Specifically, they recommend implementing activities such as group discussions (GD) and presentations to help students overcome fear and better prepare for the future. The suggestion emphasizes the importance of making the course more practical by incorporating elements like internships, presentations, and micro-teaching by students. Additionally, there is a call for further advancements in the course to ensure a well-rounded learning experience. A few students also asked for more placement drives for the students.
