1. Report on the International Women's Day Film Screening Event


5. Cancer Awareness Talk on Foundation Day of Aastha








<u>6. Attended a Special Lecture Program organized by Purva Bharati Trust Foundation Day</u> in collaboration with Jorhat Law College

On August 25, 2024, 11 students from our institution CKB Commerce College, including 9 female and 2 male students, attended an enlightening lecture titled "Journey of Criminal Laws in India Post the Nirbhaya Incident in 2012" from 10:30 am in the Auditorium of Jorhat Science Centre and Planetarium. The event was organized by the Purva Bharati Educational Trust in collaboration with Jorhat Law College as part of the Foundation Day celebration of the Trust. The lecture aimed to shed light on the evolution and impact of criminal laws in India, particularly focusing on changes brought about after the horrific Nirbhaya incident in 2012, which had a profound influence on the country's legal and judicial reforms. The resource person for the event was Advocate Vrinda Grover, a prominent human rights lawyer and women's rights activist known for her work in advancing women's rights and legal reforms in India. The call for participation was extended to the CKB Commerce College Women's Cell 'Aastha' and the College Union, encouraging students to take part in this important discussion on legal progress in the aftermath of the Nirbhaya case. Overall, the session was highly informative, providing our students with valuable insights into the Indian legal landscape, especially in terms of laws concerning gender justice and women's safety. 7. Threadpreneur Workshop

A 7 day Threadpreneur Workshop was successfully organized by Aastha CKB Commerce College Women's Cell, from 24th September to 3rd October 2024 in the Aastha Conference hall. The workshop aimed to equip the girl students of the college with practical skills in sewing, fostering an environment of empowerment and entrepreneurship. The primary goal of the workshop was to provide hands-on training in using sewing machines to create various garments. This initiative sought to inspire young women to embark on the path of entrepreneurship, enabling them to develop self-reliance and financial independence through skill-building. Under the expert guidance of Mrs. Arundhati Dutta, an experienced resource person, the workshop trained 15 girl students. Over the course of 7 days, participants were taught to sew different types of garments including: different types of Blouses, Dohi Bota and Kurta.

Mrs. Dutta ensured that the participants not only learned the technical aspects of sewing but also developed the confidence to independently use sewing machines for creating garments. The workshop received an overwhelmingly positive response from the students. Many expressed that the experience was highly beneficial, as it provided them with a marketable skill that could be transformed into entrepreneurial ventures. The Threadpreneur Workshop was a resounding success, fulfilling its objective of promoting skill development and entrepreneurial spirit among young women. The workshop's success serves as a testament to the power of education and skill-building in shaping the future of young women.











8. Attended a Workshop on Skills Development




9. Her Voice, Her Verse: Poetry Writing Competition


